Feast Day: September 21st as one of the Martyrs of Vietnam

Saint Tôma Thiện entered the seminary of the Paris Foreign Missionary Society in the apostolic vicariate of Cochinchina, Vietnam in his late teens. He was born 1820 in Trung Quan, Quang Binh, Viet Nam. He was beaten and strangled on September 21st, 1838 in Nha Bieu, Quang Tri, Vietnam and Canonized by Saint Pope John Paul II on June 19, 1988

Profile / Tiểu Sử:

Trần Văn Thiện sinh năm 1820 trong một gia đình đạo hạnh tại Trung Quán tỉnh Quảng Bình, con ông bà Hiêrônimô Miên, hai chị là Yến và Sào. Chị Yến về sau đi tu. Cậu Thiện được người dì tên là Nghi làm bề trên nhà dòng, hết sức thương yêu giúp vun trồng ơn gọi đi tu. Mồ côi cha từ lúc 10 tuổi, cậu Thiện được cha Chính giúp đỡ dạy dỗ để sửa soạn cho vào chủng viện. Vào thời đó, vua Minh Mạng rất ghét người Công Giáo, muốn tiêu diệt tận gốc, nên ra lệnh cấm đạo, bắt người Công Giáo phải đập ảnh Thánh Giá để tỏ dấu bỏ đạo.

Năm 18 tuổi, Tôma Thiện được lệnh bề trên gọi vào Di Loan để nhập chủng viện An Ninh. Dù đang lúc bắt đạo dữ dội, cậu Thiện vẫn cương quyết lên đường cùng với chị Sào đi Di Loan tuân hành lệnh bề trên chẳng nề quăn nguy hiểm đang chờ đợi. Khi chị Yến cho biết tình hình bắt đạo ở Di Loan, và cha bề trên Kim đã trốn ẩn, cậu Thiện đã nói với chị: "Dù không gặp Ngài, em cũng phải tới nơi cho chắc. Cha gọi em, em không thể không đi." Đó là tinh thần kính phục người trên trong đức vâng lời và chu toàn bổn phận trách nhiệm. Tôma Trần Văn Thiện bị thắt cổ chết vì đạo ngày 21.9.1838 lúc 18 tuổi tại pháp trường Nhan Biều.

SCHOOL RULES AND PROCEDURES

The Rules and Procedures at Saint Tôma Thiện Catholic Sunday School are for the greater good of the school community. They are intended to help each student grow in personal responsibility, and self-discipline while displaying the good manners and characteristic of a member of a Catholic Sunday school. Our mission is to glorify God by providing church educational resources that are true to God’s Word and encourage maturity in Christ. Young disciples will learn what it means to be disciples of Christ by following Him and in turn help their peers to come and follow Christ.

Being a student at Saint Tôma Thiện Catholic Sunday School imposes responsibilities on each student in the classroom, gym, and schoolyard. In the classroom students are responsible to:

1. Keep the desk and area around the desk neat.
2. Be responsible to bring books and other materials to class.
3. Be respectful of school property and that of others.
4. Have textbooks at all times.
5. **Be in full uniform each Sunday.**

Uniform/Dress Code: Saint Tôma Thiện Catholic Sunday School has a specific uniform which identifies a student as a member of our school community to the neighborhood. It must be worn respectfully, neatly and spotlessly. Students must be in complete school uniform attire every Sunday during school hours unless otherwise specified.

1. White/light blue polo with school logo, navy blue, black or khaki pants, **NO JEANS. TIGHTS, Uniform of TNTT is considered official.** (Học sinh phải mang đồng phục: áo trắng/ xanh với bảng hiệu của trường, quần màu xanh đậm, đen hoặc loại khaki. Nếu học sinh không mặc đồng phục, nhà trường sẽ thông báo cho phụ huynh biết. Đồng phục của TNTT được chấp nhận.)
2. Blue skirt (appropriate length- touching the knee)

Code of Conduct: As a community of learners, Saint Tôma Thiện Catholic Sunday School has established certain standards and guidelines to aid in preserving the ideals of Sunday school. At the core of this Code are the ideals of honesty and integrity. Thus, the following actions are deemed inappropriate and will result in administrative review:

1. Bullying and cyber-bullying
2. Disrespect/disobedience/fighting
3. Possession of a dangerous object/weapon/sharp object or any item considered a threat to the personal safety of our students and staff members.
4. Tagging, destroying, defacing school property
5. Cheating
6. Being in unauthorized areas without supervision, (e.g. halls)
7. Causing disorder on the school/church property
8. Improper language or behavior
9. Eating or drinking in the school other than at specified times
10. Chewing gum
11. Littering
12. Any other serious and inappropriate behavior offensive to our school

Discipline Policy: Discipline implies a willingness on the part of a student to accept responsibility for his/her actions. Acceptance of one's actions and their consequences help an individual to grow socially and emotionally. The basis of disciplinary action is to lead a student to recognize the inappropriateness of his/her behavior while respecting the dignity of others and themselves.

1. Teachers will handle students exhibiting unacceptable behavior. If they think it is necessary, they will refer the student to the school administration.
2. Students who are disrespectful by action or word to a teacher, staff member, or any person in a supervisory will be referred to school administration. Serious and/or continued breeches in behavior will require a parent/teacher/principal conference and may result in suspension or expulsion.
3. Any student engaging in physical violence will immediately be removed from the situation and a parent will be required to come to school and take the child home. Serious and/or continued infractions may result in suspension and/or expulsion.
4. Knowledge of any of these infractions whether they occur inside or outside of our school and comes to the attention of any of our school members will be brought to the immediate attention of the student's parents/guardians.
5. The proper authorities will be notified when necessary

Attendance Policy: Attendance on an uninterrupted basis is important for academic continuity. The administration and staff consider every Sunday as a valuable learning experience and excessive absences are viewed with grave concern.

1. **Maximum allowable number of un-excused absence is three (3).** Students must have a written notice from his/her parents within one week of an absence for it to be excused. Email notice is acceptable. Students who have more than three (3) un-excused absences will not have enough credits to advance to the next grade.
2. Students are considered late for school once morning announcements and prayers have begun at 9:00AM. Students arriving late must visit the office to sign-in as “late for school.” Students will be issued a late pass which they must present to the teacher. A student with 3 or more latenesses equivalent to 1 un-excused absence.
3. Students are expected to make up missed work within a time frame established by their teacher(s).

Cell Phones and Electronic Devices Policy: We understand that today many children have cell phones to stay in contact with their parents.

1. Cell phones and ALL electronic devices are prohibited during class hours. They are expected to be turned OFF and kept only inside the student’s schoolbag. If not, teachers/staffs at their discretion can confiscate the phone and return after class. Repeated offenses will result in notice/meeting with parent.
2. The administration, faculty, staff, and school are not responsible for lost or damaged cell phones and electronic devices.

Early Dismissal/Pick-Up: Early pick up of children during the school day is frowned upon. Students are required to come on time and stay for the duration of the day. If an emergency occurs and early pick up is necessary, the parent must request for early dismissal through the school office. Parent/Guardian must go to the office to sign the student out of school. Students may not be dismissed early unaccompanied by a parent or guardian.

Parents are to pick their children up on time at 1:45pm and TNTT students at 3:00pm

Grading/Report Cards:

1. Parents are to help your child with his/her homework and follow his/her progress closely. (Phụ huynh cần giúp đỡ và theo dõi sự học cũng như bài vở làm sau mỗi buổi học của học sinh.)
2. Homework Request for an Absent Student: A parent/guardian may request homework assignments by contact directly with your child’s teacher via listed email/phone.
3. Grades are based on class work, homework, quizzes, tests, and individual and group projects. Each of the preceding categories will receive a weight that in turn will determine the final average. Will be determined by teachers.
4. Report cards are distributed two times a year. The first is at the end of Fall semester. The final report card is at the end of school year.

First Communion Class: Parents are to help your child with his/her First Confession and First Communion preparations, such as assisting Catechists with the scheduled workshop, attending meetings, and providing prompt transportation. (Phụ huynh cần giúp đỡ con em mình trong việc chuẩn bị xưng tội và rước lễ lần đầu cho con em của mình như phụ giúp thầy cô giáo lý trong việc tham dự hội họp và đưa đón các em.)

Confirmation Class: Parents are to help your child with his/her Confirmation preparation, such as assisting with various tasks at the Retreat, and helping the candidate to select his/her sponsor.

(Phụ huynh cần giúp đỡ con em của mình trong việc chuẩn bị đón nhận Thêm Sức như phụ giúp tại cuộc tĩnh tâm và giúp các em chọn người đỡ đầu.)

Emergency Contact Information: Student emergency contact information should always be up-to-date. Any change in address, telephone numbers, or other pertinent family information must be given to the school office as soon as possible

Lunch/Recess:

1. All students are to eat lunch in the school cafeteria. Parents are to provide your child some money (typically \$1 or \$2) to purchase snacks during recess.
2. Talking is permitted in the lunchroom. Loud talking, shouting or running is not allowed anywhere in the building.
3. It is the student's responsibility to keep the area where they are seated free of debris
4. Weather permitting, students will use the schoolyard for recess with Supervisor
5. When weather conditions prevent students from going outside, they are permitted to bring books, playing cards, or small games to the gym for use during recess
6. Misbehavior will result in the loss of recess
7. Contact sports, running, tag games, ball playing, and electronic games are not permitted
8. When the bell rings, children are getting ready for Viet Ngu Period. When the second bell rings, children are expected to remain calm so that they may proceed to their rooms.

Parents are encouraged to help Catechists and Teachers organize weekly tasks and special events, such as serving food and drinks during recess and other events such as the Easter Egg Hunt, Tết Celebrations, Christmas celebrations, the Picnic, and Year-End Celebration.

(Trường Thánh Tôma Thiện khuyến khích Phụ huynh giúp trường và thầy cô giáo trong công việc điều hành trường mỗi tuần, lo phân phát thức ăn và đồ uống trong giờ nghỉ -- cũng như những buổi lễ đặc biệt như Lượm Trúng Phục Sinh, Tết Việt Nam, Lễ Giáng Sinh, Picnic và lễ bế mạc khóa học mỗi năm.)

Registration/Tuition:

Families may pay tuition in full at pre-registration, regular registration, and late registration. Tuition is applied the same as Catholic or Non-Catholic. Students must have a valid Baptismal Certificate on file.

1. Registration Phase I: \$140 per student.
2. Registration Phase II: \$140 per student.
3. Late Registration: \$160 per student.
